- If you plan to apply either Early Decision or Early Action to a school you must make sure to notify the College Office and your SSR writer ASAP but no later than October 8<sup>th</sup>. At the senior assembly each student was given *College Selection Guidelines*. Bring this completed form to your interview.
- In order for the College Office to schedule an interview for you, you must complete *The College Selection Worksheet* on line. Each student's SSR update must be completed by Sunday, September 19<sup>th</sup>.
- Before first period and after tenth period students may drop by the College Office to ask (quick) questions. No interviews will be scheduled during these times.
- There will be a meeting for all National Merit Semifinalist on Wednesday, September 22 after 10<sup>th</sup> period in Lecture Hall A.
- Representatives from the Air Force Academy will meet with students outside the Student Cafeteria on Wednesday, September 15, 2004, periods 6 thru 8.

**FEE WAIVERS:** A small number of fee waivers are available for the College Board SAT I and SAT II exams and the College Application fees. If you wish to obtain a waiver, you must complete a Confidential Financial Form which is now available from Ms. Eilen in the College Office and return it together with a copy of your parents' 2003 Income Tax Return and W2's. **Unless you use a fee waiver for SAT I and SAT II, you cannot receive college application fee waivers.**
