**SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAMS**

Need money? Turn to [www.scholarships.com](http://www.scholarships.com), a free college scholarship search service and financial aid resource.

Polytechnic University Jacobs Scholarship is awarded to students interested in pursuing a degree in Chemical and Biological Engineering. The scholarship is worth \$6,000 per year. To be eligible students must have a B+ average, combined SAT of 1350 with a 650 math score or higher, completed or currently enrolled in AP courses in one of the following: chemistry, biology, calculus, or physics. If interested students should submit an application to Poly in addition to a scholarship application. Deadline is January 31, 2006 but scholarships are limited so apply TODAY.

National Commission for Cooperative Education offers 113 merit co-op scholarships for students applying to co-op programs. Complete the application online at [www.co-op.edu](http://www.co-op.edu). Deadline is February 15, 2006.
